Question: What does this mean in terms of paying our U.J.A. Pledge? Answer: You pay your U.J.A.

Pledge at the same time of year as proviously. For example: if you made your 1960 Pledge in September and paid it on December 31, 1960, you may now make your 1961

Pledge in May and pay it on Dec. 31, 1961. The change in date should not exert any additional hardship on anyone.

Question: What does the change in date mean to the Beneficiaries?

Answer: The Beneficiaries will be able to budget more realistically than in the past, since the Edmonton Jewish Community Council, the Talmud Torah and the Edmonton Zionist Council, which acts on behalf of the United Israel Appeal and United Jewish Relief Agencies, work on a September 1 to August 31 fiscal year. This means that they will know exactly how much money they will have to work with. In the past, they have had to set up their actual working budget before a campaign was completed.

The changed timing of the U.J.A. Campaign means that the Israel Bond Drive, a campaign to raise investment dollars for Israel, will be conducted in the fall.

Mickey Dlin has been a resident of Edmonton since 1926. He came to this city from Chipman, Alberta, and attended high school here. He joined the RCAF as an air gunner in 1940. Going overseas as a Pilot Officer wireless air-gunner, he began his active duty in Scotland, From there he was posted to North Africa, where he was promoted to Flying Officer and then Flight Lieutenant, in charge of the gunnery school. He hit the front pages of Canadian newspapers when his plane was lost at sea. For three days, he and his crew-mates were in the shark-infested waters off Africa, clinging to the remaining half of a rubber dinghy. After his miraculous rescue, and a period in hospital, he made a tour of duty as a gunnery instructor in Scotland. He was then remustered, went on a pilots' course in Canada, won his wings and was discharged. Mickey won his airgunnery wings, his pilots wings and his operations wings. His proudest possession is the Gold Fish Badge for being rescued at sea. He was married to Sybil Podolsky just prior to his discharge from the RCAF. In 1945,

he left the air force and joined Dol-


