## Community Council Annual Meeting June 4

### 1972 UJA In Final Phase

With the 1972 United Jewish Appeal moving into the home stretch, outstanding cards valued at close to \$50,000 hold the key to the actual amount raised on behalf of local and overseas needs.

Originally scheduled to close on April 12, this major communal fundraising effort had to be extended to allow campaigners to complete the task of maximum coverage.

Campaign chairman Norman L. Witten, at the job since the middle of February has been working relentlessly with his executive and a nucleus of about 20 canvassers to complete the massive job of assuring the fiscal stability of local beneficiaries and commitments to Israel and overseas.

Campaign reports indicate a good possibility of meeting the minimum objective provided every remaining card is covered and the campaign continues to maintain its percentage increase.

Anyone who has not contributed to the UJA before and has not been canvassed is urged to send their pledge or contribution to the Edmonton UJA, 305 Mercantile Building.

The Annual Meeting of the Edmonton Jewish Community Council will take place Sunday, June 4, 1972, 8:00 p.m. at the Jewish Community Centre Auditorium. Highlighting the meeting will be reports by the President of the Council and the Executive Director, presentation of awards to UJA leadership and the election of Community

Council Board Members at large.

The 1972 Annual Meeting will bring to a close one of the most active and productive seasons of the Council since it was established in 1954. Highlights of committee reports will be found elsewhere in this issue.




In this kind of activity, in time it is hoped that we can branch out into areas of a choral and dance group and drama groups for teens and younger children as well.

As far as the regular Youth Centre program is concerned, disruptions in use of the gym, first for repairs and then by organizational functions, seriously affected continuity in attendance. Staff problems were also a major concern. Nevertheless, in spite of many difficulties, the Youth Centre continued to provide service to 100 families in the regular program and through its camp program. In addition, increasing free use of our facilities, for special occasions and conventions by Hillel, Young Judaea, NCSY, USY, BBG, AZA and National Council of Jewish Women, provided another community service which would not have been possible without a Youth Centre operation.

Bill and Rivvy Meloff, Directors of Camp B'nai B'rith at Pine Lake, are pleased to announce the appointment of the following staff members for the 1972 season: HEAD COUNSELORS — Chuck Levine and Noreen Gofman, A Ph.D. Candidate in the Department of Sociology at the University of Alberta, Chuck Levine has served on the staff of a number of summer camps and agencies in eastern Canada. He worked at Camp B'nai B'rith last year in the capacity of canoeing specialist. Noreen Gofman will be returning for her third year at Camp B'nai B'rith. She was Machon counselor in 1970 and 1971. Noreen is a student at McGill University, where she is taking an honors course in film arts and philosophy. MACHON & JUDAIC PROGRAMMING — Jeff Leon. Jeff has served on the staff of Camp B'nai B'rith for a number of years, and has a strong background in Judaism. He is currently in his third year of an Honor's B.A. program in Sociology at the University of Alberta. ISRAELI PROGRAMMING & SPORTS — Ruth Bar-Nun. A newcomer to the staff of Camp B'nai B'rith, Ruth is a student at the Wingate Institute, a physical education teachers' college in Netanya, Israel. Prior to her army service in 1969, Ruth was an active participant in camping and recreational agencies in Israel.
