





"With the groundbreaking ceremonies planned for Sunday, August 7th, this project is our salute to Jerusalem in this year, which marks the Tenth Anniversary of its reunification."

In the early 50s Mr. Ofer served as Vice Counsul at the Consulate General of Israel in New York, thereafter as Second Secretary and personal assistant to Ambassador Fban in the Embassy in Washington and at the Israel Mission to the U.N. in New York. His following assignments abroad were First Secretary and then Counsellor at the Embassy in London and Consul General in Zurich and in Boston. In 1972 and 1973 Mr. Ofer was a member of the Israel Delegation to the Un General Assembly.

During his intermittant years of service in Jerusa-. lem he was Deputy Director of the Commonwealth division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and later acting Director of the West European division.

Prior to his appointment to Ottawa, Minister Ofer was Director of the Israel Universities Study Group for Middle Eastern Affairs in Jerusalem.
