Exhibitors are particularly requested to mail their entries to the Secretary a week before the Exhibition and be careful to sign name to entry list.

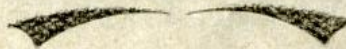
The entry fees in each section will be 10 per cent of the first prize of that section.

ABSTRACT OF RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS AND ENTRIES

— 0 —

Particular attention is directed to these rules as in all cases they will govern Exhibits and Entries.

All Entries must be made on the printed forms supplied for that purpose, one of which is enclosed in each Prize List. Additional forms may be obtained from the Secretary

No Entries will be taken after 12 noon on the first day of the Exhibition.

For each Exhibit a ticket will be presented to the Exhibitor, specifying the class and section and the number of entry, and this ticket must be attached to the Exhibit by the exhibitor and remain attached during the show.

In the Pure-Bred Classes papers of proof of eligibility to register, must be produced to the Secretary at the time of making Entry.

No animal shall compete in more than one class or section except for Herd and Special Prizes. Brood Mares may, however, be exhibited in harness in the class to which they belong.

All Exhibits must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor.

All Exhibits must be on exhibition by 12 noon on the first day and must not be removed before 4 p.m. on the last day of the exhibition.

If in the opinion of the judges any animal or article shown is considered to be inferior in quality, it shall be left to their discretion as to whether any or no prize shall be awarded.

The Society will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any animal or article entered for competition.

The Society will in no case become responsible for any Special Prize offered.

Any person interfering in any way with the judges shall forfeit any premiums to which he otherwise might be entitled.

The Membership Fee for the ensuing year shall be deducted from any prize money coming to a member.

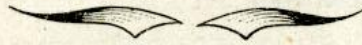

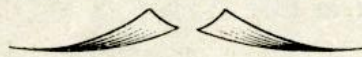

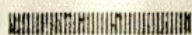
