

SYNOPSIS-



In 1908 he obtained his Captaincy in the 101st Edmonton Fusiliers and served continuously in this Regiment up to and about November, 1914, when he volunteered for active service, and was appointed Senior Captain in the 31st O. Battalion, C. E. F. Through his zeal and ability he was promoted Senior Major, and Second in Command of the 51st O. Battalion, C. E. F., in January, 1915. On the organization of the 63rd O. Battalion, C. E. F., in June, 1915, he was entrusted with the raising of the same and given the command.



Lt. Col. J. W. H. McKinnery

First Commission, December 13th, 1895. Served throughout the South African War, twice wounded, recommended for V, C. 1901. Raised half of Princess Patricas Canadian Light Infantry in August 1914, and went with them as Major. Returned in June, 1915, and raised the 66th O. Battalion, C. E. F. which he commands.
